HOW TO USE THIS OUTLINE — This is a listener's companion for the Battle 15 audio teaching. Follow the five movements, capture insights in the note spaces, and prepare to execute your Field Orders in the Battle Log.

MOVEMENT 1

The Most Dangerous Stage

0–5 minutes

Stage V is Ascension — and Ascension is the most dangerous stage of the campaign. Because it is the stage at which the fruit of the previous four stages begins to be visible. Competence is established. Discipline is functioning. The interior is being stewarded. And precisely because of this — the most ancient enemy of the ascending leader arrives.

◆ Why Stage V is the Danger Zone

The greatest threat to the leader who has done the work is not external opposition. It is internal elevation — the subtle shift from instrument to origin, from steward to source, from servant to master. Pride does not arrive as an obvious enemy. It arrives as earned confidence, appropriate self-assurance, and the clarity of a person who has genuinely paid the price of preparation.

MOVEMENT 2

Solomon's Case

5–15 minutes

Solomon is 52. Apostolic leader of a significant network. The most accomplished person in this campaign's field record. And the most acutely at risk — because of it.

◆ The Seven Faces of Pride

Pride of achievement (using what you have built as the standard by which others are measured). Pride of knowledge (the subtle contempt for those who have not yet understood what you have understood). Pride of sacrifice (weaponising what you have endured as leverage against others who have not paid the same price). Pride of anointing (the confusion between the gift and the giver). Pride of access (the misuse of the proximity to spiritual authority as a status marker). Pride of tenure (seniority as superiority). Pride of comparison (the satisfaction of being ahead of someone specific).

MOVEMENT 2 KEY INSIGHT

MOVEMENT 3

Seven Faces — Seven Humility Practices

15–35 minutes

Each face of pride has a specific humility practice designed to address its root. Generic humility aspiration is insufficient — the practice must match the specific expression of pride.

◆ Achievement & Knowledge Pride

Achievement pride: practice is intentional gratitude tracing — every achievement traced back to the grace, the people, the seasons, and the God who made it possible. Knowledge pride: practice is deliberate learning from those with less formal competence — seeking the insight available in the room you would naturally discount.

NOTES

◆ Sacrifice & Anointing Pride

Sacrifice pride: practice is releasing the accounting of what you have paid — the leader who is keeping score of their sacrifice is using it as currency rather than offering it as worship. Anointing pride: practice is the regular, deliberate return to the source — the recognition that the gift operates through you, not from you, and that the channel serves only while it remains clean.

NOTES

◆ Access, Tenure & Comparison Pride

Access pride: practice is the servant use of proximity — deploying access on behalf of others rather than as a personal status marker. Tenure pride: practice is the discipline of learning from those with less experience — what does a younger leader see that tenure may have made invisible to you? Comparison pride: practice is the deliberate celebration of the specific person you are most tempted to measure yourself against.

MOVEMENT 4

The Humility Architecture

35–50 minutes

Humility is not a feeling or a personality disposition. It is a set of practices that, sustained consistently, produce the interior posture that God honours and that the assignment at Ascension level requires.

◆ The Accountability of the Ascended

The leader at Ascension level faces a specific accountability challenge: they have reached a position where fewer and fewer people have the standing to speak into their life. This is not freedom — it is exposure. The Ascended leader must proactively seek the corrective voice and protect the accountability architecture with increasing deliberateness as elevation increases.

NOTES

◆ The Submission Practice

Submission is not weakness at Ascension level — it is the most sophisticated expression of wisdom available to the senior leader. The leader who has nothing left to submit to has nothing left to protect them from their own blind spots. Find the form of submission appropriate to your level of ascension. Maintain it deliberately.

MOVEMENT 5

Field Orders & Declaration

50–60 minutes

Seven practices — one for each face of pride. This is the spiritual architecture of Battle 15.

◆ Protocol 01 — The Pride Inventory

Rate all seven faces of pride (1–10) for current activity. Identify the primary face. Write one specific recent example. Name the humility practice that addresses it. File when complete.

◆ Protocol 02 — The 21-Day Humility Practice

Apply the specific humility practice for your primary pride face, daily for 21 days. Write one sentence per day: what the practice required and what it produced. File when 21 days complete.

Build into me the humility that the Ascension level requires — not as a performance but as a practice.

The fallen crown is laid down. The One who lifts is the One who gives. I bow before advancing.
